Trees For Free!

If you haven't participated in Saanich's "No Cost Boulevard Tree Program", do consider it!

Saanich now partners with many community associations to plant trees on municipal frontages. The terms remain simple. Homeowners fill out an application form, available on NQCA's website at <u>northquadra.ca</u> to be directed or mailed to Saanich Parks. Park staff later contact the resident to discuss tree selection and site suitability. In the fall, staff plant the tree while residents agree to water the tree for 5 years. It couldn't be easier! And what a way to assist with urban forest regrowth and enhance your streetscape!

I must begin this message by paying tribute to the recent passing of our dear and respected Saanich Councillor, Vic Derman. His tireless community service to North Quadra, his place of residency, Saanich and the CRD, was immense and leaves a big hole on the political landscape. His influence ensuring the community's betterment will be sorely missed. (See below)

This was, once again, a busy year for us. Following our name-change to North Quadra Community Association (NQCA), our executive worked hard to amend our Constitution in compliance with new changes to the Society's Act. At our upcoming AGM you will have an opportunity to ratify our new Constitution and Bylaws.

Our webmaster, Arun Joshi, with the assistance of Lauraine Derman and Trevor Barry, continue to work hard keeping our website updated. Henceforth, if you wish, you may apply for a NQCA membership at our <u>northquadra.ca</u> website. Residents of North Quadra, age 18 and over, are eligible to become members. There is no membership fee; however donations, no matter how small, are appreciated.

As you may know, there are many key initiatives currently underway in Saanich. They include the Active Transportation Uptown Douglas Corridor Plan, Nigel Valley Redevelopment Plan, an independent consultant's review of the

Environmental Development Permit Area (EDPA) and Governance Study. NQCA will continue actively providing input to these initiatives until such time as final reports proceed to Council. I urge all residents to become familiar with these and other issues, to provide input and to make your views known to Saanich Council and your association.

This year a large portion of NQCA's monthly executive meetings related to the review and consultation of several area development proposals and updates. (See p3)

Once again our annual Beckwith Music in the Park Concert event last July was a resounding success! We look forward to this summer's July 18th Music In The Park concert/picnic which will feature added children's activities relating to Canada's 150 Birthday Celebrations. (More details p3)

Tribute: Vic Derman



With sadness the community mourned the passing of Counsellor Vic Derman, March 17, 2017. Vic was a proud resident of North Quadra where his community involvement began as a volunteer and neighbourhood advocate. His service as director for NQCA from 1990 to 2002 was invaluable. He was elected to Saanich Council in 2002 and went on to be a CRD director. He not only served Saanich and CRD unselfishly with dedication and passion for livable communities, sustainability and the natural environment, but was a vital link to our community association concerns. He will be remembered locally for spearheading the acquisition of parklands on Christmas Hill, securing amenities for neighbourhoods undergoing development, advocating for greenbelts and connective walking/cycling trails throughout North Quadra and the CRDalways with the view of making "our world a better place".

Development Updates: Keeping Informed Of Neighbourhood Changes

<u>Three Sub-Division Applications likely to move forward this year:</u> There are two RS-6 lots for 4103 Quadra Street and 4122 Quadra Street and six RS 8 lots for 931 Beckwith. The Beckwith subdivision will require sewer extensions.

<u>Development Proposal at Payless Gas site: 4079 Quadra:</u> Plans include six 3 storey townhomes on a 1500 m2 site after 4.3 m road dedication along Quadra. NQCA would like to see this site, subject to site remediation compliance, consolidated with neighbouring properties so that a comprehensive development proposal may be considered.

<u>Development Permit Amendment at 4098 Lockside (Don Mann Excavating)</u>: The revised proposal to construct an office building and four workshop bays to the north of the site (rather than south which would negatively impact adjacent properties) has resolved concerns to the satisfaction of nearby residents and the community association. We thank the Mann family for consultative engagement with NQCA and neighbours and for their consideration in changing site plans.

Revised Proposal for 804, 812 and 820 McKenzie: Height, density and pedestrians safety at Rainbow X Blackberry remain major concerns. The developer has proposed an access road north of these three RS-6 lots, and two concept plans to develop the remaining land. First is 5 storey 32 units condos and second is 4 storey 31 units condos. We' ve urged the developers to conduct public meetings for the residents on both sides of Rainbow Street and to include us in that endeavour.

<u>Re-development of Peninsula Bulldozing site (east end of Beckwith):</u> We've now had 2 meetings regarding this proposed rezoning of property owned by the Mann family. We expect further public meetings organized by the applicants. Since this plan requires extension of the urban containment boundary, we urge residents to provide their views.

Morris Drive sidewalk: We are still patiently waiting completion of the 165 meter "missing link" portion along west Morris in front of Lake Hill School. The lack of sidewalk along this section forces pedestrians, especially school children, to cross mid-block through heavy traffic at Clatworthy; a situation deemed by school reps and residents to be a high safety risk. Budget financing and approval was reached in 2016, however Engineering has been unable to schedule this project due to a backlog of infrastructure work in Saanich.



After 25 years of service to NQCA, Colonel Stanley Brygadyr (known to us as Stan) will be retiring as our Secretary.
